EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:

- ALL CATTLE WILL BE UNDER SHELTER
- All cattle must be secured by halter.
- All cattle must be ear tagged with an NLIS electronic ear tag.
- Exhibits are required to be prepared and presented in accordance with the practices as described in the All Dairy Breeds Show Ring Code of Ethics. The Show Ethics Committee will oversee compliance with the code.
- Due to changes in regulations regarding Johnes Disease there is no requirement for exhibitors to provide a Johnes Status Declaration. Separate stalling and wash areas are available on request for MN rated cattle under the MAP Scheme.
- In all sections, second prize money will be paid if there are three or more entries per class.

PLEASE NOTE: Jersey and Combined Breeds will be judged as separate classes, but by the same judge so if numbers warrant, milking classes in both sections will be judged first, followed by the dry classes.

At the discretion of the stewards, extra classes may be added if class sizes are excessive.

Only the handler and calf will be allowed to enter the judging ring.

All calves to be born in 2021 and before 30 September.

NOTE: An area for calves to be penned separately from adult cattle will be available.

All cattle must have NLIS ear tags. No bull calves.

A special ribbon inscribed **NOORAT SHOW** will be presented to all children not winning a prize in this section.

Entries in this section confined to registered stock only.

The ages of beef stud cattle are those on or between which an exhibit must be born. Ages for cattle date will be taken from the date of the show.

The Exhibitor gaining the most points in the Supreme Beef Exhibit call at shows conducted by affiliated societies, points allotted: 5 points for Supreme Beef Exhibit, 1 point for Reserve Supreme Beef Exhibit.

Points only of the Supreme Beef Exhibit will be counted unless there is an equal count of two or more exhibits on the first count, and then only the points of the Reserve Supreme Beef Exhibits will be counted.

The association reserves the right to check identify of the winning exhibit.

CATTLE EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:

- **All cattle must be ear tagged with an NLIS electronic ear tag.**
- All cattle will be under shelter.
- All prize winners must be paraded.
- No one will be allowed in the Judging Ring or Circle except officials, committee persons and people in charge of exhibits.
- Ring events will be run to times as set out in program notice.
- Exhibits must not wear ribbons previously worn at any show.
- All stock must be tied.
- Due to changes in regulations regarding Johnes Disease, there is no requirement for exhibitors to provide a Johnes Status Declaration. Separate stalling and wash areas are available on request for MN rated cattle under the MAP Scheme.
